RJ's 787 – first 787 to land in Montréal–Pierre Elliott Trudeau International Airport and Detroit Metropolitan Wayne County Airport

Amman, Nov.30, 2014- Royal Jordanian's 787 with a capacity to fly 270 passengers will touch down at Montréal–Pierre Elliott Trudeau International Airport (YUL) and Detroit Metropolitan Wayne County Airport (DTW) on Dec. 1, 2014, being the first Dreamliner to land at either of the two North American airports.

Regional Director /North America & Canada Zyad Jaradat said: "RJ is pleased to serve its North American destinations with the revolutionary 787. Tomorrow will be the first time we operate any of our Dreamliners to Montreal and Detroit, which are served twice weekly each, from Amman, Jordan. Royal Jordanian initiated 787 service to Chicago on Nov. 30 and New York on Nov. 8. RJ directly connects Amman with Chicago with four weekly services and New York three times weekly."

Jaradat added that North American destinations are the longest-range destinations on the RJ route network. For this reason, we care to accommodate our customers with the highest comfort standards onboard. The 787 features a host of new technologies that greatly enhance the passenger experience. Royal Jordanian customers in all classes will also experience cabin environment improvements such as LED mood lighting, larger windows, bigger overhead bins, lower cabin altitude and enhanced ventilation systems, among other features.

He also said: "The passengers will remarkably enjoy the in-flight entertainment system on the Dreamliners - The TopSeries Avant System - which is distinguished for advanced technologies such as high definition video and faster processors. He pointed out that this system offers passengers the next level of in-flight entertainment with17" in Crown Class and 10.6" touchscreens in Economy.

James Cherry, President and CEO of ADM said: "Aéroports de Montréal is very pleased to welcome Royal Jordanian newest B787 and we are proud to offer this aircraft with the latest technologies allowing it to run a truly modern and seamless operation,"

He added: "With this latest addition, the local community will have the opportunity to experience one of aviation's most technically advanced passenger aircraft."

Detroit Metropolitan Wayne County Airport Authority CEO, Thomas Naughton said: "Royal Jordanian provides important international air service that is particularly valuable for our large Middle Eastern community."

Royal Jordanian welcomed its fifth 787 aircraft last week, thus completing the assimilation of the first group of its 787 order, under the airline's strategic plan to renew its long-haul fleet. The 787s that RJ acquired are a new, advanced generation of the 787.

The airline will resume receiving the rest of the ordered Dreamliners starting with 2016 and throughout the following few years.

The 787 provide airlines with unrivaled fuel efficiency, using 20 percent less fuel than today's similarly sized airplanes and enabling it to offer an exclusive ecofriendly performance.

The new planes also enable airlines to increase their cargo revenues by providing about 20 -30 percent more cargo capacity than the current airplanes of the same size.
