Students join Detroit Metropolitan Airport, Wayne County Parks and partners for fourth annual Arbor Day event

-- 2019 marks the largest year yet for the event

SUMPTER TOWNSHIP, Mich. (April 23, 2019) – Nearly 300 students will learn about the environment with a hands-on approach, while giving back to the community, during the fourth annual Arbor Day event sponsored by Detroit Metropolitan Airport (DTW), Wayne County Parks and their partners. This year's theme is "Trees, Bees and Me." Sixth graders from Romulus Middle School and Renton Junior High School in New Boston will learn about sustainability; the important role of bees, trees and insects in the ecosystem; and the value of wetlands. The opening ceremony will begin at 9:15 a.m. on Friday, April 26 at Crosswinds Marsh Wetlands Interpretive Preserve, 27600 Haggerty Road, Sumpter Township.

Crosswinds Marsh is one of the largest and most successful wetland mitigation projects in the country. The 1000-acre nature preserve is maintained by Wayne County Parks under an agreement with the Wayne County Airport Authority—which operates Detroit Metropolitan Airport and Willow Run Airport—making Crosswinds Marsh the ideal location for this collaboration.

Throughout the event, students will participate in discussions that explain the importance of bees to our food system and how our food supply will be impacted by the decline in bee populations. Participants will have a chance to watch bees in an observation hive and take honey from local beehives. Several Michigan native trees will also be planted at the park. Students will leave the park with their own saplings to plant at home in honor of Arbor Day.

"The Wayne County Airport Authority is committed to giving back to the community," said WCAA CEO Chad Newton. "There is no better way to do that than by educating a child and leaving an imprint on their minds. Arbor Day is an event that we look forward to every year. And – this marks our largest year ever. Representatives from the Airport Authority and Wayne County Parks will kick off the Arbor Day event with a brief program at **9:15 a.m.** Immediately following, students will rotate between six learning stations hosted by United Lawnscape, Green Toe Gardens, Wayne County Conservation District and Wayne County Parks. Students from Huron High School will give back to their community by assisting the younger children at the stations. The festivities will end around 2:00 p.m.
